

ArtS is a three year Erasmus+ project, which aims at the exploitation of the Cultural and Creative Sectors (CCS) potential for creating growth and jobs and at the enhancement of cultural economy at local, regional, national and transnational levels.

ArtS shall define and forecast labour market needs in the Cultural and Creative Sectors (CCS) in Greece, Italy and Spain and design appropriate teaching and training methodologies in order to deliver a joint training programme that will respond to these needs.

The project will cover the following areas: Craft, Performing arts (music, dance, theatre), Cultural Heritage (archives, libraries, museums), Literary arts (book and press), Visual arts, Audiovisual and multimedia.

It will contribute to a) the development of a Vocational Education and Training (VET) curriculum, according to EQF/ECVET standards, that is outcome-oriented and responds to specific skill shortages in the creative and cultural sectors' market, b) the facilitation of networking and labour mobility, c) the innovation of the VET sector through the design and delivery of a novel training programme.

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ArtS project will exploit the Cultural and Creative Sectors (CCS) potential for creating growth and jobs and enhance cultural economy at regional and transnational levels.

The purpose of ArtS project is to respond to a strong need for a partnership between the cultural and creative sectors (CCS), social partners and training providers in order to identify the current and future skill requirements of the culture and creative labour market in Greece, Italy and Spain and to develop an innovative joint training programme which will have to provide sectors with the mix of skills needed for creative entrepreneurship.

The specific objectives of the project are:

Innovation

- design and deliver a flexible training programme that will develop coherent teaching methodologies and tools tailored to the needs of the CCSs' for the first time;
- define the CCS occupational profiles and connect them to skills and learning outcomes for the first time.

Impact

- involve all stakeholders for exploiting the VET potential for creating growth and jobs;

- enhance cultural economy at regional and transnational levels;
- promote the application of EQAVET 'European Credit System for Vocational Education and Training' and EQF 'European qualification framework'/ECVET 'European credit system for vocational education and training' frameworks that ensure both quality and better Skills for the Creative Economy / ArtS transferability of the project's results.

Sustainability

- create a lasting partnership of all types of stakeholders that will monitor and adjust to changes in the sector's needs;
- facilitate labour mobility and mutual trust between the sectors' stakeholders;
- provide transversal skills as well as career guidance, career management skills and access to the labour market, thus improving their long-term employability.

The results are expected to contribute to:

- the development of a VET curriculum that is outcome-oriented and responds to specific skill-shortages in the creative and cultural sectors market;
- the facilitation of networking and labour mobility in the CCS;
- the innovation of the VET sector through the implementation of an original training programme that will be based on interactive learning methods;

in order to deliver a joint vocational training

programme that will have to provide unemployed, self-employed and low skilled artists the opportunity to:

- update their professional competences and acquire management, business and networking skills;
- guide them into finding work or internship at a company of their choice;
- present their work in a joint project at the project closure that will be prepared by the learners themselves, as an exercise of effective networking.

Diversity is an asset in creating an innovative yet targeted training programme and in ensuring the project's impact, sustainability and dissemination. Throughout its implementation the project will ensure equality of opportunity.
